Architectural Policy Recommendations in Response to the Changing Policy Environment

Due to policies of the new government, and passing of architectural legislations such as the 'Urban Regeneration and Assistance Act', 'Architectural Service Promotion Act', substantial changes to the architectural sector is expected.

This study aims to review the policy outcomes of the first Architecture Policy Fundamental Plan launched in 2010 so that pre-emptive measures can be taken in response to changed government policies. Furthermore, taking into account currently discussed megatrend notions and plans of the new government, the research derives policy agendas and conditions that need reflection in the establishment of the second Architecture Policy Fundamental Plan.

First, in order to understand the performance outcome of the Plan, central and local government reports on architecture and urban programs from May 2010 to June 2013 were monitored. The compiled articles were categorized into architectural culture, green architecture and city, and spatial environment design. Each of these three categories were analyzed under six sections namely planning, improvement of legislation, project implementation and support,

system establishment, research and education, and finally, event and promotion.

Additionally, major issues of the architectural sector were investigated through literature review of various government and research institution's future studies report, from both Korea and abroad. In terms of methodology, the STEEP analysis, which measures social, technological, economic, environmental, and political conditions, was used as it is widely employed in future studies research. Moreover, a survey of 25 architecture and urban experts was conducted to find out what new issues may rise from the architectural sector. The survey also inquired what changes in condition would affect future architectural issues, and its respective significance.

Last, in consideration of the results of the survey, the new government's plans, and a comprehensive review of the current Architecture Policy Fundamental Plan, the study concluded by making recommendations of improvement to the future establishment of the Plan.
